

## IF THE PERSON WAKES UP...

Lay them on their side. Explain what just happened and how it's important that they be seen by a health professional. The risk of another overdose after the first one is high because naloxone has a short duration of action.

Tell the person that they should not use opioids in the next few hours to avoid another overdose.

Stay with them while waiting for help. The Good Samaritan Law provides protection for overdose witnesses and victims.

- Store naloxone in a cool, dark place
  Check the expiry date
- Do not fill the syringes in advance
- Naloxone can be injected through light clothing
- Dispose of used syringes and needles safely

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
