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Global Development Delay (GDD) 0-7 years-old	 □ Diagnostic report following a development assessment concluding in the presence of a significant delay (greater than 2 standard deviations below the mean), in at least 2 of the following areas: • Fine or gross motor skills • Cognition • Communication • Personal and social development • Activities of daily living A doctor or designated professional must confirm the diagnosis based on the impairments noted in
	the professional's report. An exception is made in the case of 0-7 year old children with a diagnosis of Down Syndrome. A medical assessment is sufficient.
Intellectual Disability (ID)	 □ Report with psychological diagnosis must be produced by a psychologist or neuropsychologist considering all clinical data. Presence of an intellectual disability is based on the 3 following criterias, according to the DSM-5: • Significant limitations in intellectual functioning ✓ Tools: WISC IV, WAIS III or other standardized tool • Significant limitations of adaptive behaviour ✓ Tools: Vineland, ABAS- II or other standardized tool. • Limitations occur within developmental period
